Small Business Technical Assistance

Our small business team helped a variety of businesses from farm, salon, and restaurant owners, to fitness, music and nonprofit organizations.

136 businesses were counseled55% of are clients were business owners of color

226 jobs were created or retained

Assisted with 11 grants totaling \$100,572



Housing and Financial Services

Whether it was learning how to prepare and purchase a first home to families needing support to avoid eviction or foreclosure, our housing services staff were ready to lend a hand.

398 households completed our First-time Homebuyer's Class

115 households purchased their first home

47% of homebuyers were people of color

42 households avoided eviction

66 homeowners avoided foreclosure

\$1,531,069 in assistance funds were distributed

Community Organizing: Developing Leaders that Lead

- •165 steward graduates recognized in May and November 2023 graduations
- •122 of our 2023 graduates are people of color
- •50 stewards who have graduated since the start of our program now serve in decision-making positions. Fitchburg Mayor, Sam Squailia has both taken a class and taught a class.
